- 1. Skate Park- Designed and built through a collaboration with the Public Art Committee and members of the community to serve as a state or the art Skate Park for generations of youth in our community.
- 2. Baseball Mural- with the Artwork by Jeff Cornish, the Public Art Committee helped facilitate the production and dedication to the Legacy Park Baseball Field Location: Fred Moore Hwy, just west of King Rd.
- 3. St. Clair's Sesquicentennial Mural-The St. Clair Public Art Committee had an integral part with finding and financing this great piece of artwork by Eva Hermesmeyer.

 Location: St. Clair Boat Harbor, M-29 just south of the Pine River bridge.
- 4. China Park Portal- the collaboration of China Twp Parks and Recreation, Public Art Committee, and many contributors we developed a park that was artistic, educational, and inviting to all. The portal designed by Dave Fry is a sim-plistic entrance to the park. The patio designed as the State of Michigan and includes a sculp-tured fire pit displaying landmarks of St. Clair County.

Location: King Rd, just south of Recor Rd. China Twp.

- 5. Riverview Plaza Courtyard- The Community Foundation of St. Clair engaged the talents of the Public Art Committee to help revitalize the Riverview Plaza's courtyard to include a grass theater for community arts as well as simple and friendly places to meet.

 Location: Riverview Plaza, M-29 St. Clair
- 6. Riverview Plaza Fountain- Part of the plaza's revitalization project was to design a functional, but artistic fountain depicting the beautiful St. Clair river waterway. After many months of designing and construction, the fountain was raised and serves as a functional artwork of "Two Ships Passing" by Dave Fry.

Location: Riverview Plaza, M-29 St. Clair

7. 8. 9. Library Mural, Stained Glass, and Street Banners- The St. Clair Library is home of the beautiful mural creation by members of the Public Art Committee, Jason Stier and Sandy Attebury for the purpose of making reading fun for our children. Also, hanging from the ceiling you can find a few of the street banners created by local artist from the community. These banners were displayed on light poles along our city streets. The Stained Glass was another project the Public Art committee commissioned for the library. Location: St Clair Library. 310 South 2nd St.

10. Wally, Fish **0**ur of Water- Wally was the Public Art Committee's most unique project they have taken on. After two years of planning and construction, Wally was born. Local artists of all ages came together to create small ceramic tiles to create this mosaic masterpiece. Wally stands nearly 6' and is about 10' long and serves as a monument of our community's love for art and as a welcoming giant for all our visiting boaters. Location: Rotary Park - Clinton Ave., along the Pine River and public docks.






